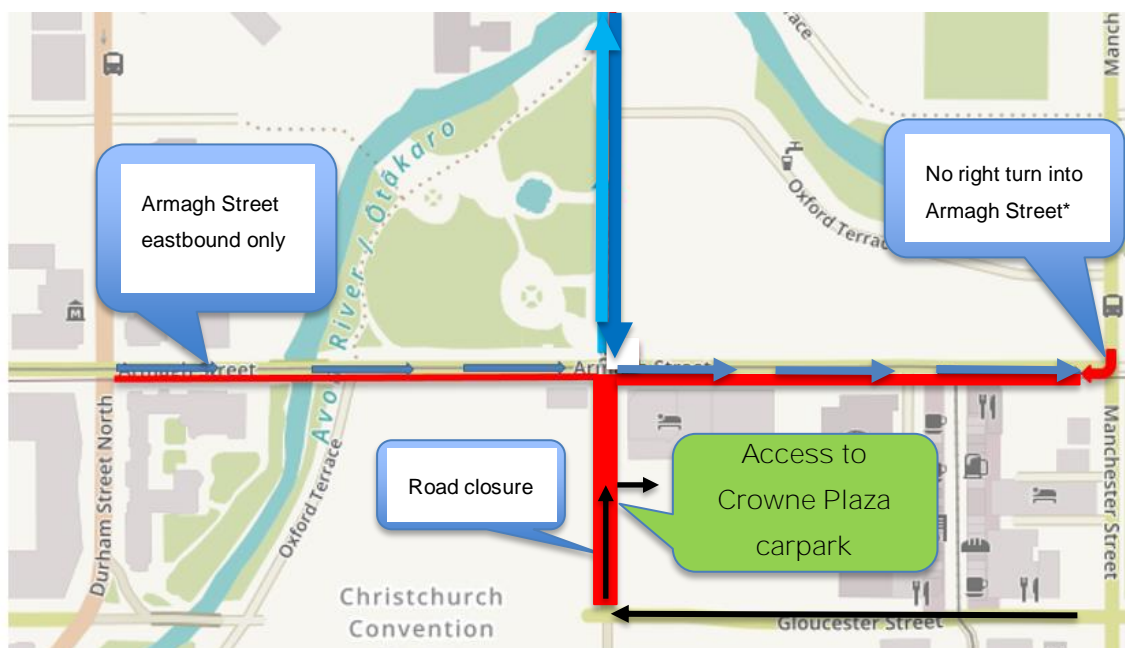


Notice of work: Night closure June 2018

What	Ōtākaro and Christchurch City Council works
Where	Colombo Street from Armagh Street to Gloucester Street
When	5 th – 14 th June from 6pm till 6am each night

WHERE ARE WE WORKING?



*Until August. This is due to Central City Transport projects work which is transforming Manchester Street into a tree lined boulevard prioritised for buses. The crew are currently replacing a damaged stormwater pipe. Contact Downer on 027 204 0424 for more information.

WHAT ARE WE DOING?

Work on Colombo Street near Victoria Square is almost complete. Colombo Street between Kilmore and Armagh Streets returns to two-way traffic on Friday 1 June.

There are **three stages** to the upcoming work on Colombo Street from Armagh to Gloucester Street.

STAGE ONE: 5 – 6 June

6pm – 6am

Ōtākaro night works

Over two evenings we will run new underground ducts from The Lady Isaac building to the Crowne Plaza. These will power the light signals at the intersection.

STAGE TWO: 5 – 10 June

6pm - 6am

Christchurch City Council night works

The Christchurch City Council needs to replace a damaged wastewater pipe over five nights near the intersection of Armagh and Colombo Street. There will be significant noise associated with this work.

STAGE THREE: 11 – 13 June

6pm – 6am

Ōtākaro night works

We will be milling (preparing) and asphaltting Colombo Street over three nights to complete the last major piece of work on this section of road. This work will create some noise due to the type of machinery that needs to be used.

Work will take place at night to minimise disruption to the travelling public.
